

THE GUIDING LIGHT FROM THE GROTTO 7TH SUNDAY OF EASTER JOHN 17:11b-19

MAY IS THE MONTH OF MARY ~ THE MOTHER OF US ALL

This week, the statue of the Blessed Mother will be crowned twice. Today, Sunday May 12th the First Holy Communicants from our School and Religious Education will crown Mary at the 9:00 am Family Mass, in their Holy Communicant outfits. Then, the 2nd graders will crown her on Wednesday, May 15th.

As we celebrate Mother's Day, it is a great time to crown Mary, who is the Mother of the Church and Mother of us all.

May is the Month of Mary. For centuries, the Catholic Church has emphasized the month of May as a time of honor and devotion to the Blessed Virgin Mary. Parishes and families often celebrate with special pilgrimages, devotions, or placing a crown on a statue of Mary, traditionally called a "May Crowning."

On April 29, 1965, Pope St. Paul VI promulgated his encyclical Mense Maio ("The Month of May"), which promoted May devotions to the Blessed Mother, knowing that, "the person who encounters Mary cannot help but encounter Christ likewise" (n. 2). Despite being a lesser-known encyclical, its timing and topic are revealing.

Released on the eve of the last session of the Second Vatican Council and amid escalating violence and unrest of the Vietnam War and the 1960's, the help of Mary was "a matter of top priority" considering "the present needs of the Church and the status of world peace" (n. 3). The words of St. Paul VI are just as relevant today. In our contentious social and political climate, focusing on Mary is not a pious distraction from real issues, but a vital source for grace, truth, and mercy.

In his encyclical, Pope St. Paul VI writes:

"This year, we in turn feel compelled to call of prayers from the whole Catholic world. Looking at the present needs of the Church and the status of world peace, we have sound reasons to believe that the present hour is especially grave and that a plea for concerted prayer on the part of all Christians is a matter of top priority.

In praying for peace, the Holy Father states that peace "is not solely the work of man. It primarily is a gift from God that comes from Heaven. We shall attain peace through our protection and intercession of the Blessed Virgin Mary, the Queen of Peace".

"Throughout this month of May, let us offer our prayers to the Mother of God with greater devotion and confidence so that we may obtain her favor and her blessings." Even if we sin, we must not forget that God "is the Father of mercies and the God of all comfort" that he has appointed Mary most holy as the generous steward of His merciful gifts." ~ Mense Maio ("The Month of May") Pope St. Paul VI

As we look to Mary our Mother who always intercedes for us in bringing us to Jesus, may we give thanks to Almighty God for our mothers, living and deceased, who remind us of Mary's faithfulness, perseverance and love. Happy Mother's Day Moms! May the Blessed Mother continue to intercede for each of you. May God bless you and Mary keep you.

Reflection for Next Sunday Pentecost May 18, 2024

First Reading: Acts of the Apostles 2:1-11
Second Reading: 1 Corinthians 12:3b-7,12-13
Gospel Reading: John 20:19-23

Jesus appears to his disciples and gives them the gift of the Holy Spirit.

Family Connection

Pentecost is sometimes called the birthday of the Church. The Gospel for Pentecost reminds us that the Church begins with the command to forgive. Within the family, the domestic church, we learn how to forgive and how to accept forgiveness. The gift of the Holy Spirit enables us to do both. Today is a fitting time to share a family celebration of reconciliation.

As you gather together as a family, sit quietly for a few minutes, inviting everyone to reflect upon their need to forgive and to receive forgiveness. If there is a situation or issue within the family that needs attention, spend some time reflecting on how your family might address it. Read together today's Gospel, John 20:19-23. Talk together about how Jesus gave us the gift of the Holy Spirit to help us in the work of forgiveness and to bring us peace. Pray together today's psalm or the Prayer to the Holy Spirit, asking that the Holy Spirit help your family. Share with one another the Sign of Peace.

A Case for Reclaiming the Language - Abortion is Child Sacrifice

Here we are in 2024 preparing for the most consequential presidential election in my lifetime, and the ungodly Left is actually using abortion as one of the issues they believe will help them win the presidency.

Nothing less than the choice between liberty and tyranny hangs in the balance. How far have we descended as a nation that abortion—the killing of innocent human life—can actually be thought of as a selling point for one of the major political parties. More importantly, how can we win the argument to preserve the sanctity of life for the benefit of our posterity and the preservation of the blessings of liberty?

We must reclaim the language. He who establishes the language wins the argument. We have allowed the left to define the argument as one over "abortion". The word "abortion" carries the connotation that a woman's right is the issue. No one wants to deny a woman her rights. That is completely understandable. However, the word "abortion" says nothing of the rights of the child in the womb.

If we are going to win the argument for the hearts and minds of Americans, we will have to change the language to focus more on the life and the rights of the baby in the womb. We must call "abortion" what it actually is: "child-sacrifice".

That is not hyperbole or exaggeration. It is, in fact, what abortion is; it is the sacrificing of a baby for the "choice" of another. We must change the subject of the debate from the woman to the baby. In the present debate over abortion, the happiness of the woman is preferred over the life of the baby. That ought not to be the case. Most reasonable Americans will agree. We can win this argument.

It will take public leaders to be bold enough to change the terms of the debate. Yes, the left will push back, but we must be firm knowing that truth is on our side. It is, in fact, the sacrifice of a child for the choice of another. That is precisely what child-sacrifice is.

Let us win this debate. For the benefit of the unborn and the continued greatness of our nation.


