**FOURTH OF JULY - FREEDOM IS NOT FREE - IT IS A GIFT**

As we celebrate this Independence Day 2024, one item we should never forget, is our Religious Liberty. In the document on Religious Freedom by the USCCB (US Catholic Bishops), entitled Our First Most Cherished Liberty, the Church emphasizes that “We are Catholics. We are Americans. We are proud to be both, grateful for the gift of faith which is ours as Christian Disciples, and grateful for the gift of liberty which is ours as American citizens.” One should not place one against the other. As we celebrate 4th of July, the founding of our nation, let us remember that Religious Liberty is the first liberty granted to us by God and protected in the First Amendment to our Constitution. It includes more than our ability to go to Mass on Sunday or even to pray the rosary at home. It encompasses our ability to contribute freely to the common good of all Americans. Religious liberty is the ability to express our religious beliefs wherever we are, especially in the Public Square without fear of repercussion. What is happening in China, Nicaragua, Nigeria, Russia should never happen here.



Over the past decade, religious liberty has been threatened around the world, including in our own country. We as Catholics Christians have witnessed push backs from our own government and some corporations forcing our fellow brothers and sisters to compromise on their conscience and act contrary to Catholic teachings. Happily, the Little Sisters of the Poor, who may have been forced to pay for contraception was backed by a Supreme Court ruling who said this was unconstitutional. Last June the U.S. Supreme Court issued an unanimous ruling in favor of a postal worker who was targeted and disciplined by his employer because he refused to work on Sundays because of his religious beliefs.

However, the struggle continues as forces try to disguise their righteousness under the cloak of social justice and civil rights. In Morris County, NJ there is a law suit going on against the county that is trying to exclude religious organizations from receiving its generally available grant programs. The Notre Dame School of Law filed a brief backing a lawsuit against Morris County stating that this act “violates the law and harms religious schools and communities.”

Over this past year, since the overturn of Roe V. Wade and the Israel/Hamas War, the U.S. Bishops reported a substantial increase in violence against many Houses of Worship in our nation. The U.S. Bishops in a yearly report “Religious Liberty in the United States” says that there has been an increase in an alarming rate of “vandalism, arson and other property destruction at Catholic sites.” In 2022 the bishops reported that the annual hate crime statistics gathered by the FBI reported anti-Catholic crimes as nearly 75% higher than for any other bias. This all compounded by a “general failure” on the part of the federal government to apprehend and prosecute the perpetrators of such attacks. In addition, at least 3 states Washington, Vermont and Delaware have introduced bills to eliminate the clergy-penitent privilege, potentially forcing priests to break the seal of confession or face legal consequences.

What should be most alarming to us is that the Biden administration effectuated the “most consequential actions” on religious liberty primarily through several key regulations issued in 2023. Among these were the HHS (Health & Human Services) contraceptive mandate and the Equal Employment Opportunity Commission’s regulations that threaten to require religious employers to make accommodations for abortion, contraception, and sterilization.

Also notable, the report mentioned the FBI’s leaked memo from it’s Richmond, VA office in January 2023, that revealed evidence that several

FBI offices were investigating and surveilling certain Catholic parishes that were described in the memo as “radical traditionalist Catholics” sympathetic to “extremist ideological beliefs and violent rhetoric.” This was all under the guise of Right-Wing White National Movements. The FBI would send in undercover agents, pretending to be Catholic into traditional parishes, that hosted the Latin Mass, to engage in conversations with parishioners and report them back to the FBI.

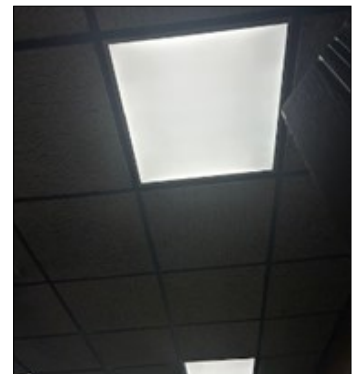
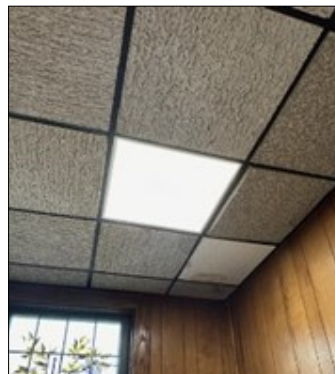

Are you willing to stand up to our own government and say, “Enough!” During this Religious Freedom Week, it behooves us to keep ringing in our ears the wise words spoken by the late, great Archbishop Fulton Sheen, who warned us: “A religion that doesn’t interfere with the secular order will soon discover that the secular order will not refrain from interfering with it” (The Catholic Thing-Stravinskus).

As we celebrate our 248th birthday, may the Lord continue to bless our land, our government and leaders. May the bells of freedom continue to ring in our hearts and our souls as we continue to burn the light of freedom around the world. Happy Birthday America and to all of us here at Our Lady of Lourdes! May God bless America and the whole world. Stay safe this Summer and please remember Jesus by going to Sunday Mass whether you are at home or on vacation. There is no vacation from the 3rd Commandment-Keep Holy the Sabbath Day.

Family Connection

Our family plays an important role in shaping us and forming our self-identity. In family life, we find a safe place to discover who we are and who God calls us to be. But sometimes the influences from outside our family can make us unrecognizable to those who know us best. These outside influences can lead us away from God, or they can lead us toward a deeper relationship with God. In today's Gospel, we see that the people of Nazareth could not recognize Jesus as the Son of God. They could know him only as the son of Mary. We hope that through our family life we will be encouraged to filter the many influences on our lives through the lens of faith so that we will become the person that God calls us to be. As you gather as a family, talk about the people and events that are influencing members of your family. Acknowledge that many of these people and events are positive influences, helping us be better people and leading us to a deeper relationship with God. Also acknowledge, however, that there are negative influences in our lives that risk pulling us away from God. Observe that Jesus was a person who allowed his relationship with God to be the most important thing in his life. This led many people to have faith in him as the Son of God. However, not everyone could recognize this about Jesus. Read today's Gospel, Mark 6:1-6. Ask: Who does not recognize Jesus as God's Son in this Gospel? (some of his kinfolk in Nazareth) Observe that because of the people's lack of faith, Jesus could not perform many miracles in Nazareth. Conclude by praying together that our families will continue to help us follow God in our lives. Pray together the Prayer for Vocations.

CATECHISTS NEEDED:

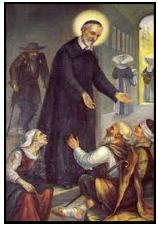

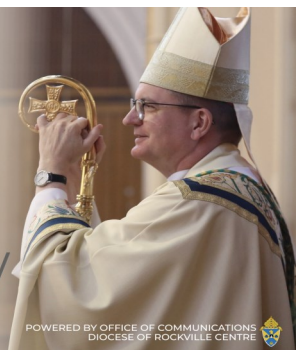
