

UPDATE ON THE DIOCESE OF ROCKVILLE CENTRE BANKRUPTCY

Dear Friends in Christ,

Many of you are aware that the Diocese of Rockville Centre has been undergoing a Chapter 11 bankruptcy process since October 2020. This was precipitated by the New York State Legislature's passage of the Child Victims Act in 2019, which allowed lawsuits for historical (past) accusations of child sexual abuse, regardless of how many years or decades ago the alleged abuse occurred. The number of lawsuits brought against the Diocese, our parishes, schools, and other ministries made it impossible to equitably compensate victim-survivors of child abuse with meritorious claims through court trials. Without bankruptcy, the first survivors in line to receive compensation would have been paid, while others would receive nothing.

Bankruptcy provided the possibility of equitable compensation and some measure of healing for survivors while allowing the Church to continue its mission of proclaiming Jesus Christ. A key priority was to secure the future of our parishes. The Diocese, along with every parish and ministry, contributed to the settlement in order to accomplish these goals. To resolve all past claims of abuse of minors and to secure the future of the Church's ministries across Long Island, it was necessary for every parish to participate in the Chapter 11 bankruptcy process. This was to ensure that no historical (past) claims could jeopardize parishes or schools in the future.

Our parish contributed to the settlement of all cases. Since the bankruptcy process will not be completed until December 3, 2024, I am not at liberty to disclose the amount contributed by our parish. The funds came from our reserves, known as the UNITAS account, which is an investment account used for the benefit of our parish.

Please understand that the cost of litigating current or potential future historical cases against our parish, especially if judgments were rendered, would be devastating to the future of Our Lady of Lourdes. This is about protecting our parish both now and in the years to come.

We pray for all survivors of child abuse, that by the grace of our Lord Jesus Christ and through the compassion of others, they may find healing and comfort. We also pray for our parishes and all ministries that serve God and the

common good of all people on Long Island, asking Mary, Mother of the Church, to intercede for us. Thank you for your prayers, understanding, and encouragement during this challenging period. Out of this dark chapter in the Church's history, we look forward to a time of resurrection, to a Church purified and eager to bring the saving message of Jesus Christ to all people. As St. Julian of Norwich said, "All shall be well, and all shall be very well."

May God bless you, and may Mary keep you and your families always.

Reflection for Next Sunday

31st Sunday in Ordinary Time November 3, 2024

First Reading: Deuteronomy 6:2-6

Second Reading: Hebrews 7:23-28

Gospel Reading: Mark 12:28b-34

Jesus is questioned by a scribe about the greatest commandment.

Family Connection

As Christians, our moral behavior is guided by the two -part commandment taught by Jesus in today's Gospel: love God and love your neighbor as yourself. Many of us learned to use this framework as an examination of conscience. By examining our lives through the lens of these commandments, we have learned that the challenge of these commandments is not in our desire to follow them but in our capacity to consistently honor these commandments in our daily lives.

For one week, identify and collect news reports of how Christians show their love for God by loving and serving their neighbor. Clip these news items and share what you have heard when you gather as a family. Read together today's Gospel, Mark 12:28b-34. Talk about ways in which your family might contribute to the examples of Christian service you found. Choose one of these actions to do together as a family. Conclude in prayer together asking God to help us show love to our family members and friends. Pray together the Act of Love.

First Friday Evening Devotions November 1, 2024 ~ 8:30 pm Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament <u>Prayer Hour for Life</u>

The Real Presence of Christ is the gift He gave us at the Last Supper, and when we come to church, we are truly in the presence of our God, our Creator and our Redeemer.

On the First Friday of each month, we gather before our Eucharistic Lord to pray that the culture of life will prevail over the culture of death, that respect for all human life from conception to natural death will be restored in the hearts and minds of all God's children.

What is the Parent Replacement Act?

Proposition 1 (Equal Rights Amendment [ERA]) is a constitutional amendment on the ballot on <u>November 5th</u>.

This would amend Article 11 Section 1 of the New York State Constitution to include ethnicity, national origin, **age**, disability, or sex, including sexual orientation, **gender identity**, gender expression, pregnancy, pregnancy outcomes, and reproductive healthcare and autonomy.

What does this mean for Parental Rights in NY?

This amendment will usurp parental rights, eliminate girl's sports, and give minors access to irreversible transgender procedures. If passed, Proposition 1 (ERA) will:

- Allow minors to access irreversible medical treatments, including gender transition drugs and surgeries, **without parental consent**.
- Prevent schools from informing parents if their child is considering or undergoing a gender transition.
- Prohibit organizations and educational institutions from excluding males from participating in female sports.
- Permit biological males to enter female restrooms, locker rooms, and other female-only spaces.
- Potential for further legislation that would erode parental oversight and involvement in children's education and medical decisions.

What can YOU do to fight the Parental Replacement Act?




