#### JOIN US FOR A EUCHARISTIC PILGRIMAGE

This weekend you have an opportunity to join me in a Eucharistic Procession that is part of a NATIONWIDE EUCHARISTIC PILGRIMAGE that leads us to the EUCHARISTIC CONGRESS in Indianapolis this upcoming July 17 - 21, 2024. This is the longest Eucharistic procession in history where thousands of people will process with our Lord Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament along four different routes throughout the country all leading to Indianapolis.

The four routes are the Marian Route (North), St. Elizabeth Ann Seton Route (East), the St. Juan Diego Route (South) and the St. Junipero Serra Route (West). The route travels 6,500 miles.

On Monday May 27th, Fr. Tony Stanganelli and I will be part of the Eucharistic procession from St. Charles Borromeo Church. We will process from St. Charles Borromeo Church to Our Lady of the Angels Church-St. Andrew and finally to Pier 69 before the pilgrimage heads southwest to Metuchen, NJ and Philadelphia, PA.

This is an exciting time where we can witness publicly to one of the largest cities in the world that Jesus Christ is fully present in the Eucharist, Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity. Eucharistic processions are a way to praise and honor God and give public witness to one's faith. They serve as a reminder of the Catholic faithful's spiritual journey toward eternal life with God.

Anyone who meets up with the Pilgrimage along one of the four routes is considered to be part of the greater Eucharistic Caravan and will have the opportunity for a plenary indulgence. Every Catholic in America is invited and encouraged to be a part of the Pilgrimage in this way!

Catholics who cannot leave their homes for a serious reason and who participate in spirit with the National Eucharistic Pilgrimage—uniting their prayers, pains, or inconveniences with Christ and the Pilgrimage—will also be granted a plenary indulgence.



## Focus on Religious Freedom <u>Memorial Day 2024 - Some Gave All</u>

Memorial Day, originally called Decoration Day, is a day of remembrance for those who died in our nation's service. It is in our remembering that these American patriots live on. It is by continuing their steadfast defense of our liberties, especially Religious Freedom, that we honor their sacrifice and live up to their rightful expectations of those who live and breathe in the very freedoms for which they died.

Since the first battles to gain America's independence, the families of 1.8 million Americans have sacrificed the joy and presence of their loved ones to the defense of America's freedoms. On this Sunday before Memorial Day, how fitting that prayers for these fellow Americans should fill our hearts with gratitude for their sacrifice. Let us remember them in the parades and memorial services, by placing flags on their graves, and reading their epitaphs.

We can acknowledge and thank today's surviving families for their loved ones' service and take part in the National Moment of Remembrance with respectful silence at 3pm on Memorial Day.

John Adams, one of our Founding Fathers, said, "Posterity! You will never know how much it cost the present Generation to preserve your Freedom! I hope you will make good use of it. If you do not, I shall repent in Heaven, that I ever took half the Pains to preserve it."

America's freedom of religion is under grave and immediate threat from government regulations, denial of freedom of speech and court-determined imposition of secular values. Because America's religious freedom is now under attack, we must assume an active defense of what Pope Benedict XVI called "the most cherished of Americans freedoms".

In good conscience we can do no less. Our children's freedoms are not ours to lose.

The United States Conference of Catholic Bishops' prayer for all who died in service to our nation:

"O God, by whose mercy the faithful departed find rest, look kindly on your departed veterans who gave their lives in the service of their country. Grant that through the passion, death and resurrection of your Son they may share in the joy of your heavenly kingdom and rejoice in you with your saints forever. We ask this through Christ the Lord. In the Gospel, Jesus calls His disciples to become evangelizers.

#### **Reflection for Next Sunday**

The Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ June 2, 2024

First Reading: Exodus 24:3-8
Second Reading: Hebrews 9:11-15
Gospel Reading: Mark 14:12-16,22-26

Jesus shares his Last Supper with his disciples.

#### **Family Connection**

In the beginning of today's Gospel, Jesus instructs his disciples to make preparations for the Passover meal. Like most meals, the Passover meal required planning and preparation. Our celebration of the Sunday Eucharist also requires planning and preparation. Certainly the ministers at the Eucharist prepare for their roles: the person presiding prays and prepares the homily; the prayers of petition are written; the music ministers prayerfully select music and practice it before Mass; Eucharistic ministers, lectors and altar servers prepare carefully for their roles. As the worshiping assembly, we can also prepare for the Mass through our prayer during the week, by reading the Scripture before Mass, and by making ourselves present to the Eucharistic celebration.

As you gather as a family, talk about some of the things that are required to prepare for your family meals. Plan together a special Sunday meal by choosing the menu, preparing the shopping list, and assigning duties for cooking, setting the table, preparing decorations, leading the prayers, and cleaning. Read together today's Gospel, Mark 14:12-16,22-26. Notice how Jesus instructed his disciples to prepare for their Passover meal. All meals require some kind of planning and preparation; so, too, our Sunday Eucharist requires planning. What might we do as a family to better prepare for our celebration of the Eucharist? Choose one or more ideas to begin to implement together as a family. Pray together that God will help your family make your celebration of the Eucharist the highlight of your week. Pray together the Lord's Prayer.



My dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ:

Long Island is blessed to be home to several of the nation's most renowned healthcare systems. These systems consist of a vast network of physicians, nurses, technicians, and medical professionals of all kinds who live and work in our communities. In my weekly travels across the Diocese of Rockville Centre, I meet so many of these health professionals and I never fail to be inspired by their commitment to accompanying their patients throughout the courses of their lives. This includes the end of life.

However, legislation pending in Albany seeks to upend the doctor-patient relationship at its most vulnerable moment via physician-assisted suicide. The bill, which seems to be gaining momentum, authorizes doctors (whose careers are dedicated to healing and preserving life) to dispense pills that literally poison patients who have been given terminal diagnoses. Such a practice flies in the face of human dignity.

In fact, a groundbreaking new Vatican document approved in April by Pope Francis, titled—appropriately— Dignitas Infinita (Infinite Dignity), specifically singles out euthanasia and assisted suicide as grave assaults on human dignity which utilize "a mistaken understanding of human dignity to turn the concept of dignity against itself."

This comment refers directly to the euphemism "death with dignity" that promoters of assisted suicide favor. *Dignitas Infinita* notes that, even in serious infirmity, "human life carries a dignity that must always be upheld, that can never be lost, and that calls for unconditional respect. Indeed, there are no circumstances under which human life would cease from being dignified and could, as a result, be put to an end."

Clearly, Pope Francis views euthanasia and assisted suicide as symptoms of what he repeatedly has called a "throwaway culture" that has taken hold in the West. The pope, in his wisdom, sees what many supporters of this practice do not.

By virtue of their very humanity, people who are ill or who lack self-sufficiency never cease being infinitely valuable, even if society sends them a message to the contrary by urging them to "get out of the way" and end their lives.

What is being peddled by advocates as a last resort for those suffering from interminable pain will very quickly be expanded to resemble the dystopian nightmare we are seeing play out in Canada, which passed a law very similar to the New York bill in 2016 but which already has been expanded to allow people with non-terminal diagnoses to end their lives. In March, an Ottawa judge approved assisted suicide for a young woman whose only diagnoses are autism and ADHD, over her parents' pleading objection. The Canadian law is set to expand again in 2027 – incredibly – to allow people with mental illnesses like depression, anorexia, or bipolar disorder to access suicide pills as prescribed by a medical professional.



Sadly, Canada is not an isolated case. The situation is similar in the Netherlands, the first nation to approve euthanasia, where people living with autism and intellectual disabilities reportedly are being euthanized.

I know that these scenarios are not what people have in mind when they answer a survey question asking if they support "medical aid in dying" or "death with dignity." But we must not fool ourselves. What I'm

describing is not fiction or fear mongering; these abuses are really happening today in jurisdictions that have legalized assisted suicide.

The medical professionals whom I speak with in our parishes and at Catholic Health medical facilities understand clearly that assisted suicide is a terrible, untenable policy. They know that when the end-of-life approaches, the answer is not to actively kill patients or to help them to kill themselves. Instead, true dignity is upheld by providing compassionate palliative care which manages patients' pain and other symptoms, keeps them clean, tends to their bodily needs, and spiritually prepares them for their journey home.

As Pope Francis has said, "We must accompany people towards death, but not provoke death or facilitate any form of suicide...Life is a right, not death, which must be welcomed, not administered."

During this time when we celebrate a National Eucharistic Revival, we pray that our reverence for the Body and Blood of Jesus Christ may inspire our witness in New York State's public square to the reverence for the sanctity of human life at every stage of life.






