

# THE GUIDING LIGHT FROM THE GROTTO SECOND SUNDAY OF LENT LUKE 9:28b-36



#### THIS IS MY BELOVED SON—LISTEN TO HIM

On this **Second Sunday of Lent**, the Church once again proclaims the account of the Transfiguration of Jesus. This year, we reflect on the version from the **Gospel of Mark**.

Jesus and His disciples have been facing many challenges, including His own prediction that He will suffer and die. The disciples, expecting a Messiah who would be a military hero—one who would crush their enemies and restore Israel's power—were disheartened. Their hopes seemed shattered. But Jesus reveals that He is so much more. He did not come to remove a political enemy but to conquer the true enemy: sin, suffering, and death.

At the Transfiguration, Jesus gives His disciples—and us—a glimpse of His resurrection. He reveals that God's true power and glory are found in Him. Just as the Father commanded the disciples, He commands us today: "Listen to Him" (Mk 9:7).

To listen to Jesus means more than simply hearing His words. The Latin root of the word "listen" is *audire*, and full listening—*ob-audire*—is where we get the word *obedience*. To truly listen to Jesus is to surrender our hearts and lives to Him in faith and trust. As **Henri Nouwen** writes, "Jesus is the obedient one. He is totally open to the love of God."

In today's world, filled with noise, distractions, and endless communication, we are called this **Lenten season** to **pause and listen** to God. This week, I invite you to set aside **10 to 15 minutes each day** to be still and truly listen. You may find it helpful to pray these words from **1 Samuel:** 

"Speak, Lord, for your servant (your name) is listening." (1 Sm 3:9)

Distractions will come, but do not be discouraged. Instead, offer each distraction to God. The more we listen, the more we will begin to see where God is leading us—just as Abraham, our father in faith,

listened to God and received a blessing as numerous as the stars in the sky (Gn 22:16).

May God bless you and your families always.



He holds a Licentiate in Dogmatic Theology from the Pontifical Gregorian University, Rome.





#### Reflection for Next Sunday Third Sunday of Lent March 23, 2025

First Reading: Genesis 15:5-12,17-18

Second Reading: Philippians 3:17-4:1

Gospel Reading: Luke 9:28b-36

Jesus is transfigured in the presence of Peter, John, and James.

#### **Family Connection**

In today's Gospel, the voice from heaven speaks to the disciples saying, "Listen to him." The Transfiguration was a focused moment for the disciples when they heard God speaking to them and experienced Jesus in glory. They most certainly left this focused moment with a new appreciation for the importance of Jesus' words even if they did not yet understand everything that he had taught them. During Lent, we are invited to consider our attentiveness to Jesus and to one another. In the pace and noise that often characterizes family life, how well do we listen to one another? What opportunities do we have for quiet prayer?

As you gather as a family, count the number of pieces of equipment in your home that produce sound: televisions, radios, CD players, computers, video games, etc. Observe if sometimes more than one piece of equipment is playing simultaneously and how this might affect communication. Discuss the question: What is it like to try to talk with one another when this equipment is on?

Read aloud today's Gospel, Luke 9:28-36. Consider whether the noise and pace of your family life allows family members opportunities for quiet prayer. During Lent, it may be appropriate for your family to choose a time for quiet in the household by turning off televisions, radios, and CD players. Consider whether your family would like to establish such a time during this Season of Lent and suggest that it might allow you the opportunity to listen more attentively to one another and to find time for quiet prayer. Spend a few such moments as a family, asking God to help you listen well to one another and to Jesus.
