Eucharistic SOLEMINITY OF THE MOST HOLY BODY & BLOOD OF CHRIST Revival

Mark 14:12-16, 22-26

JESUS IS HERE

Today, Sunday June 2nd, we celebrate the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ known in Latin as **Corpus Christi.** This is a time for us as a parish to renew our belief in the Eucharist and contemplate Christ's presence among us and within us. Msgr. John J. Strynkowski, recently spoke about the Eucharist in our parish back in April. He used a simple expression to remind us about the Eucharist. He said that whenever he brought Holy Communion to his mom, she would always say, "Jesus is here!" If there is anything we can remember about this day and anytime we are at Mass and/or receive Holy Communion, may we remember that "Jesus is here!"

Here are two reflection questions from the USCCB document on the Eucharist we can reflect upon.

1) Why does Jesus give himself to us as food and drink?

Jesus gives himself to us in the eucharist as spiritual nourishment because he loves us. God's whole place for our salvation is directed to our participation in the life of the Trinity, the communion of Father, Son and Holy Spirit. Our sharing in the life begins with our Baptism. It is strengthened at

Confirmation and nourished through our participation in the eucharist. By eating the body and drinking the blood of Christ in the eucharist, we become united to the person of Christ through his humanity. In being united to his humanity we are at the same time united to his divinity.

The ultimate promise of the Gospel is that we share in the life of the Holy Trinity. The fathers of the Church call this divinization. In this we see that God does not merely send us good things

from on high; instead we are brought into the inner life of God. In the celebration of the Eucharist (which means Thanksgiving) we give praise and glory to God for this sublime gift.

2) Why is the Eucharist not only a meal but also a sacrifice?

Through Christ's death and resurrection, he conquered sin and death, and reconciled us back to God. The eucharist is the memorial of this sacrifice. The church gathers to remember and to re-present the sacrifice of Christ in which we share through the action of the priest and power of the Holy Spirit. Through the celebration of the eucharist, we are joined to Christ's sacrifice and receive its exhaustible benefits.

As the Letter to the Hebrew explains, Jesus is the one eternal high priest who always lives to make intercession for the people before the Father. In this way he surpasses the many high priests who over centuries used to offer sacrifices for sin in the Jerusalem temple. The Eternal High Priest Jesus offers the perfect sacrifice, which is his very self, not something else. Jesus' one perfect sacrifice is thus eternally present before the Father who eternally accepts it. This means that in the eucharist, Jesus does not sacrifice himself again and again. Rather, by the power of the Holy Spirit, his one eternal sacrifice is made present once again, re-presented, so that we may share in it.

In the Eucharistic re-presentation of Christs' eternal sacrifice before the Father, we are not simply spectators. The priest and the worshipping community are in different ways active the Eucharistic sacrifice. The ordained priest at the altar represents Christ as head of the church. All the baptized, as members of Christ's body, share in his priesthood as both priest and victim. In the Eucharist the sacrifice of Christ becomes the sacrifice of the members of his body, who united to Christ form one sacrificial offering. As Christ's body is made sacramentally present, united with Christ, we offer ourselves as a sacrifice to the Father.

In the Eucharistic celebration, we do not simply remember an event in history. Rather, through the mysterious action of the Holy Spirit in the eucharistic celebration the Lord's paschal mystery is made present to his spouse, the church. The whole

church exercises the role of priest and victim with Christ, offering the sacrifice of the Mass and itself completely offered in it (Mysterium Fidei 31).

At the Last Supper we read in the Gospel of Mark Jesus how fulfills the words of Moses who gave the people of Israel a share in the blessings of the covenant given at Mt. Sinai thru the sprinkling of blood upon them (Ex 24:8) Jesus now makes a new Covenant with all by pouring out His blood for us where a

new Community is formed. Through Jesus' sharing of his Body and Blood at the Last Supper and from the Cross, we now share in an eternal banquet of Heaven where all are invited to participate.

Please join us for our Corpus Christi Procession which this year begins at St. Thomas the Apostle, Chapel on Hempstead Ave following their 11:30am Mass. This is a great opportunity for our two parishes, St. Thomas the Apostle and Our Lady of Lourdes to witness to West Hempstead and Malverne, that Jesus is here. He is present to us and with us in the Eucharist, Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity just as he was to the people 2,000 + years ago.

May God bless you and Mary keep you and your families! Our Lady of Lourdes, pray for us!


The Nocturnal Adoration Society meets in the Church every first Friday. We come together as a parish to pray before the Blessed Sacrament exposed on the altar.

Revitalizing our Faith — Renewed by the Cucharist

Every day, people in our community are helped because of support from funds raised through the Catholic Ministries Appeal.


After paying the co-pays on his medications, his family's rent and utilities bills, Paul had very little left to purchase food and other necessities for his family.

It was hard for him to ask for help, but with nowhere else to turn, he did. Catholic Charities found him a specialist who assessed the family's needs and directed them to appropriate resources in their community. He went to his Parish Outreach, where his family received food that allowed them to make it through the month. Paul and his family received the help they so desperately needed.

Today, Paul is back at work and the family is doing well. "I am so thankful that I know there is somewhere I can turn, where there are people that care, people I can talk to, if I am ever in such a situation again," shared Paul.


