# THE GUIDING LIGHT FROM THE GROTTO 8TH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME LUKE 6:39-45



The Beginning of Lent, Ash Wednesday, March 5, is only three days away from Sunday. Are you ready? Don't worry if you are not—we have forty days, and it is best to start now.

When I hear the word "Lent," I have often thought of it as hardship and drudgery because it means I must work at something. Maybe you feel the same way. However, Lent can be a time of hope and joy if we give it our all. In the Church's liturgy, the first preface of Lent says, "For by your gracious gift each year, your faithful await the sacred Paschal feasts with the joy of minds made pure... that they are led to a fullness of grace."

The word *Lent* means *Spring*. During spring, we often engage in spring cleaning—clearing out the old and dusty in our homes, basements, and attics to bring in the new. After all the work, we realize that our homes are made anew, and the effort was worth it. How appropriate, then, to "spring clean" the inner home of our lives during Lent. St. Paul tells us that we are "living temples of the Holy Spirit." As temples, we need renewal so that the Lord can reside more fruitfully in us. In this Jubilee Year of Hope, we are called to become beacons of hope. This means trusting that God will always see us through life's difficulties and doubts, leading us toward His goodness.

Jesus shares with us three ways to make Lent truly effective in our lives as people of hope: prayer, fasting, and almsgiving.

**Pray with Hope** | Take time to deepen your prayer life with God. St. Pio (Padre Pio) wrote, "*Pray and don't worry*," reminding us that prayer brings comfort when we place our hope in God. Try listening to God using the scriptural passage, "*Speak, Lord, your servant (name) is listening*." (1 Samuel 3:9-10)

Fast with Hope | Catholics are called to fast from food and abstain from meat on designated days to help refocus on discipleship. The goal of fasting is to strengthen our relationship with Christ as we unite our sacrifice with His sacrifice for us.

When considering what to give up for Lent, ask yourself: *How will my fast help me open my heart more to Christ and to others?* Perhaps this is the time to fast from worry, negativity, dwelling on the past, gossip, bad habits, or even a favorite show, movie, or sports program. Use that time to focus on prayer and relationships—such as going for walks with family and friends or sharing meals together.

Give with Hope | Hope means "relying on God's love, which calls us to truly love others" (Our Sunday Visitor). When we give, may we remember that it is not how much we give, but as Mother Teresa said, "It is in how much love we put into the giving" that counts. St. Francis of Assisi reminds us in his prayer: "It is in giving that we receive."

Lent calls us to give our love not just through financial gifts but also through acts of service. Perhaps this is the time to join a ministry, volunteer to have your foot washed on Holy Thursday, help decorate the church during Holy Week, participate in the Scavenger Hunt to help others, donate to St. Vincent de Paul, or visit someone who is homebound.

Lent is not so difficult when we realize God's great love for us through His Son, Jesus. All we need to do is look at the cross, and there is little we can say except to love Him in return. May we use this Lent as a time to show our love for God, trusting in His providence and becoming a people of hope.

May God bless you and your families always.

## Why Does Lent Begin So Late This Year?

This year, Lent begins later than usual due to Easter and the cycle of the moon. Easter is a movable feast and does not occur on the same date every year, unlike Christmas.

According to the Gregorian Calendar, Easter can fall between March 22 and April 25. In the Western tradition of the Church, Easter is celebrated on the first Sunday following the first full moon on or after the Spring Equinox. This is also called the *Paschal Full Moon*. This dating was established by the Council of Nicaea in 325 A.D. The Orthodox Churches follow a different dating system based on the Julian Calendar. However, this year, both Catholic and Orthodox Churches will celebrate Easter on April 20.



Lent is a 40 day season of prayer, fasting, and almsgiving that begins on Ash Wednesday and ends at sundown on Holy Thursday. It is a period of preparation to celebrate the Lord's Resurrection at Easter.

The following fasting and abstinence regulations are observed:

**FASTING** is to be observed on Ash Wednesday (March 5, 2025) and Good Friday (April 18, 2025) by all Catholics over 18 years of age to the beginning of their 60th year. On days of fasting, one full meal is allowed. Two smaller meals, sufficient to maintain strength, may be taken according to one's needs, but together should not equal another full meal, unless dispensed or excused.

**ABSTINENCE** from meat is to be observed by all Catholics who are 14 years of age or older. Ash Wednesday, all of the Fridays of Lent, and Good Friday are days of abstinence.

During Lent, we seek the Lord in prayer by reading Sacred Scripture; we serve by giving alms; and we practice self-control through fasting. We are called not only to abstain from luxuries during Lent, but to a true inner conversion of heart as we seek to follow Christ's will more faithfully. We recall the waters of baptism in which we were also baptized into Christ's death, died to sin and evil, and began new life in Christ. Lent is a penitential season. It is a time to seek forgiveness, to look inward, and to admit our shortcomings and failures.

All faithful of the Diocese of Rockville Centre are reminded that "The season of Lent is penitential in nature and during Lent penance should be not only internal and individual, but also external and social (Sacrosanctum Concilium, No. 5, 109).





## Reflection for Next Sunday First Sunday of Lent March 9, 2025

First Reading: *Deuteronomy 26:4-10*Second Reading: *Romans 10:8-13*Gospel Reading: *Luke 4:1-13* 

In the desert, Jesus is tempted by the devil.

## **Family Connection**

In Luke's Gospel, the story of Jesus' temptation in the desert appears just after Jesus' baptism and before Jesus begins his public ministry. We can imagine this as a time of transition, a turning point in Jesus' life. Perhaps we can liken it to one of the important turning points in our own lives: the decision to marry, the birth of a child, the acceptance of a new job, or the decision to move to a new home. After the moment of decision, having reached the point of no return, we sometimes begin to wonder if we are prepared and ready for the task before us. Turning points can be times of doubt and insecurity. Jesus' response to the temptations of the devil offers an example for responding in faith when our doubts and insecurities tempt us to distrust God's sufficiency. Jesus rebukes the devil by quoting Scripture. Each citation is an affirmation of trust in God. We learn to trust in big things by practicing trust in little things. Our Lenten practices of prayer, fasting, and almsgiving invite us to trust God in these small ways. They remind us that God will suffice for us. They prepare us to trust in God in all things, especially in moments of doubt and uncertainty.

As a family, talk about ways in which trust has been built among members of the family. Observe how being trustworthy in small matters enables us to trust one another in more important matters. Offer specific examples if possible (e.g., children who establish their responsibility in household tasks can be granted greater independence and freedom to choose how they perform these tasks). Today's Gospel shows us how Jesus trusted God in all things. Read aloud today's Gospel, Luke 4:1-13. Discuss how Jesus showed his trust in God when he resisted the devil's temptations. Invite family members to name times when they have trusted God in matters small or large. Write a family prayer together. You might write the prayer so that each line begins with a letter in the word "trust." Pray this prayer together.

\*Your team will receive a point for each pound of goods collected plus




