ELECTION DAY IN AMERICA 2024

We are now approaching the climax of Election Season 2024. Like you, I will be relieved when all those political commercials are no longer bombarding us. On a serious note, it is imperative that we, as Catholics, involve ourselves in the voting process. As Pope Francis recently said in an in-flight interview, "In political morality, in general, they say that if you don't vote, it's not good; it's bad. You have to vote, and you have to choose the lesser evil." If you have already voted, like myself, congratulations. If not, I urge you to do so. Please do not ever think that your vote does not make a difference. May we no longer be the Catholic "silent majority." Speak out through your vote.

When voting with prudence, it is very important that we know Catholic teaching so we can vote as conscientiously as possible. Consider the following criteria to help make good Catholic Christian decisions, as stated by Pope Benedict XVI in 2006:

- The protection of life in all its stages, from the first moment of conception until natural death.
- The recognition and promotion of the natural structure of the family as a union between a man and a woman based on marriage.
- The protection of the right of parents to educate their children in accordance with their beliefs.

Pope Benedict identifies these three goods that flow from human life. In addition to the life of the individual—without which no other rights or goods matter—there is the life of the basic cell of society (natural marriage and family) and the liberties necessary for individuals and families to live and flourish. Thus, when comparing candidates to determine which one has the least harmful views and policy positions, all three principles must be considered.

Both the Catechism and the moral tradition of the Church teach that the voter must choose. "In our constitutional system, it is the people who govern, but we do not fulfill our role if we do not help elect those who will represent us well or prevent the election of candidates who will not. If we cannot choose a candidate who seeks the common good across the board, then we need to choose the one who will do the least harm. To choose otherwise is to abdicate our responsibility to vote." - National Catholic Register, September 25, 2024

Before you vote, say a prayer to the Holy Spirit for guidance, listen, and then vote. Please do not forget to turn the ballot over and **VOTE NO on Proposal 1**. Thank you.

Reflection for Next Sunday

32nd Sunday in Ordinary Time November 10, 2024

First Reading: 1 Kings 17:10-16 Second Reading: Hebrews 9:24-28

Gospel Reading: Mark 12:38-44

Jesus notices a poor widow's offering and commends her great sacrifice.

Family Connection

Today's Gospel leads us to think about our family's financial contributions to our parish community, the diocese, other Church-sponsored organizations, and other charitable organizations. Good stewardship invites us to share our treasure as well as our time and talent. Sometimes, however, decisions about a family's charitable giving are made without our children's knowledge. Yet we teach more when we invite all family members to be aware of how we contribute to our Church and to other charitable organizations.

As you gather as a family, talk about your family's financial contributions to your parish and to other Church activities. If your family supports other charitable organizations, you might talk about these as well. Talk together about why it is important for us to share our resources with these organizations. Read today's Gospel, Mark 12:41-44. Talk about what Jesus observes about the generosity of the poor widow. Talk also about ways in which your family might also make a sacrificial gift to support your parish or other charitable organization. (Perhaps your family might choose not to go out to dinner but to contribute the money to your parish). Invite all family members to participate in the decision about what action you will take and which organization you will support with your contribution. Conclude in prayer together asking God to help your family be generous like the poor widow in today's Gospel. Pray together the Peace Prayer of St. Francis.







Let us recommend to Jesus Christ, and to His holy Mother, all the souls in Purgatory, and offer to God for their relief the Masses of this day.





Gifts from Bethlehem

OLIVEWOOD HANDCRAFTED FROM THE HOLY LAND

A TRADITIONAL ART AND LIVELIHOOD FOR HOLY LAND CHRISTIANS

The handicrafts trade evolved as a cultural tradition of Christians in the Holy Land for many centuries. This indigenous form of art has since become an industry of great importance to the local people of the Holy Land who rely on it for livelihood, and to Christian pilgrims from all around the world whose holy pilgrimage can be memorialized for a lifetime in cherished olive wood or mother of pearl souvenirs. The olive wood carving market is the major source of income in the Bethlehem area. More than 65 percent of the income of the community in Bethlehem comes from this work.

In recent years, however, the holy crafts trade has suffered many hardships due to social and economical pressures. Because of a sharp fall in tourism and also as a result of diminishing numbers of craftsmen who leave their traditional trade and emigrate due to the difficult conditions in their homeland, the Holy Land handicraft market is facing serious danger, and so is the Christian community in the Land. Sixty five years ago the Christians represented more than 28% of the total population in the Holy Land, today they are less than 1.5%. The loss of Christians in the land of Christianity's birth will represent a tragedy of immeasurable proportions for the billions of Christians worldwide. Thank you for your vital support for a Christian tradition and in protecting this very important culture and industry.
