THE CATHOLIC CHURCH JUBILEE YEAR (2024-2026) & OUR 100th ANNIVERSARY

On Thursday May 8th Pope Francis declared a Jubilee Year for Rome and the entire Catholic Church from December 24, 2024 (Christmas Eve) to January 6, 2026 (Traditionally Epiphany). Pope Francis declared the Jubilee Year in a Papal Bull entitled “Spes Non Confudit,” which translated from Latin means “Hope Does Not Disappoint.” A Papal Bull is an official document written in Latin that bears the seal of the Pope. In his statement Pope Francis decreed that every Catholic cathedral around the world should offer Mass on Dec. 29, 2024, as the solemn opening of the Jubilee Year for their local communities. Pope Francis encouraged dioceses to organize pilgrimages to the cathedrals for the occasion.

We here at Our Lady of Lourdes are planning a pilgrimage to Lourdes, France to visit Our Lady and to Rome, Italy October 26 - November 6, 2025 with NAWAS TRAVEL celebrating our upcoming 100th Anniversary beginning the Spring of 2025 and the Jubilee Year. We will be walk through the Holy Doors of St. Peter’s Basilica and attend the Wednesday audience with the Holy Father.

A jubilee is a special holy year of grace and pilgrimage in the Catholic Church. It typically takes place once every 25 years, though the pope can call for extraordinary jubilee years more often, such as in the case of the 2016 Year of Mercy or the 2013 Year of Faith.

A central part of any jubilee is the Holy Doors. These doors, found at St. Peter’s Basilica and Rome’s other major basilicas, are sealed from the inside and only opened during a jubilee year. The opening of the Holy Door symbolizes the offering of an “extraordinary path” toward salvation for Catholics during a jubilee. Pilgrims who walk through a Holy Door can receive a plenary indulgence under the usual conditions.

Jubilees have biblical roots, as the Mosaic era established jubilee years to be held every 50 years for the freeing of slaves and forgiveness of debts as manifestations of God’s mercy. The practice was reestablished by Pope Boniface VIII in 1300.

As we prepare for the Jubilee Year and our Centennial Year 2025-2026 may we head the words of Pope Francis

who said “let us lift up our hearts to Christ and become singers of hope in a world marked by too much despair. By our actions, our words, the decisions we make each day, our patient efforts to sow seeds of beauty and kindness wherever we find ourselves, we want to sing of hope, so that its melody can touch the heartstrings of humanity and reawaken in every heart the joy and the courage to embrace life to the full.”

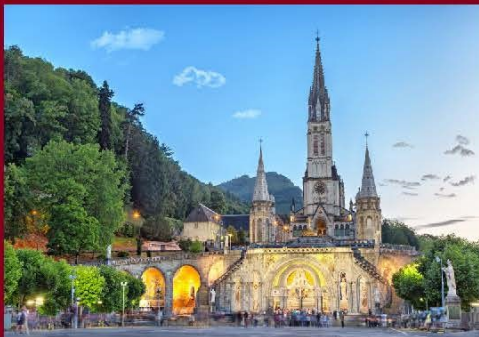

Bulletin Reflection

“Why are you terrified? Do you not yet have faith?”

**Reflection for Next Sunday
 13th Sunday in Ordinary Time
 June 30, 2024**

First Reading: *Wisdom 1:13-15; 2:23-24*
 Second Reading: *2 Corinthians 8:7,9,13-15*
 Gospel Reading: *Mark 5:21-43*

Jesus heals a woman afflicted with a hemorrhage and raises Jairus's daughter from death.

Family Connection

There are many ways in which we can compare the request for healing made by Jairus and the request of the woman with the hemorrhage. One comparison helps us think about prayer. Jairus asked Jesus for healing on his daughter's behalf; the woman with the hemorrhage had no one to speak for her and bravely approached Jesus on her own initiative. In our prayers, we do both. We intercede for others' needs, and we also courageously express our own needs to God. We find hope in Jesus' response to both of these people, who sought him out in their hour of need. As you gather as a family, talk about some of the things you have prayed for this week. Notice that some of your prayers may have been for other people, and some of your prayers may have been for your own needs. In today's Gospel we find encouragement for both kinds of prayer. Read together today's Gospel, Mark 5:21-43. Talk about the similarities and differences between the two people who presented their needs to Jesus in this Gospel. Notice that both people received the healing they sought from Jesus. We want to pray for the needs of others and for our own needs with as much faith and hope as Jairus and the woman with the hemorrhage did. Pray together in thanks and praise to God, who hears our needs and answers them, by praying today's psalm, Psalm 30.

Pray for Priests



God, our Father, please send us holy priests, all for the Sacred and Eucharistic Heart of Jesus, all for the Sorrowful and Immaculate Heart of Mary, in union with St. Joseph. We pray that the Blessed Mother wrap her mantle around your priests, and through her intercession strengthen them for their ministry. We pray that Mary will guide your priests to follow her own words, “Do whatever He tells you.” (Jn 2:5) May your priests be holy, filled with the fire of Your love, seeking nothing but Your greater glory and the salvation of souls. Amen.

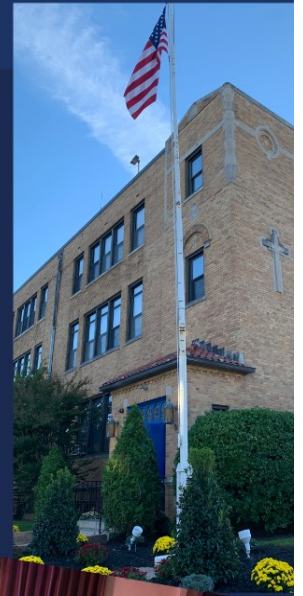

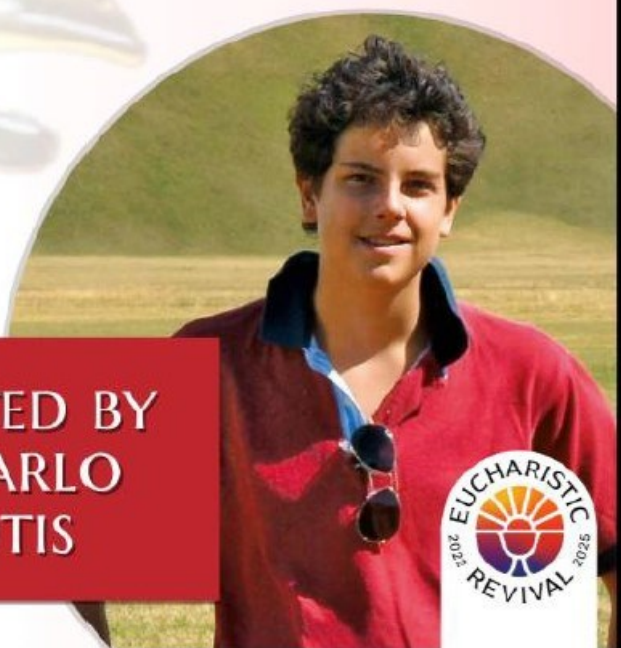

 When you log on to the Virtus website, you will create a Virtus account.
 - a. If you have not attended a Virtus class, you are a first time registrant.
 - b. The first screen will ask the name of your organization-from the drop down list select Rockville Centre-Safe Environment.
 - c. Follow all directions on the next screens.
 - d. One screen will have the **Codes of Conduct**. Please acknowledge the Codes of Conduct.
 - e. Continue with the registration process and select the class you will attend.
 - f. After selecting the class, you will be instructed to complete the background screening application.
2. Background Screening Application:
 - a. Sterling Volunteers is the company providing the background screening.
