

# THE ASCESION OF OUR LORD JESUS CHRIST INTO HEAVEN

This Thursday, May 9 the Church celebrates the Ascension of our Lord Jesus Christ into Heaven. This marks what is called the 40 days after Easter. For us here in what is called the Ecclesial Province of New York That includes all Dioceses in New York State. This Solemnity is also celebrated in the Provinces of Boston, Hartford, Philadelphia and Omaha and every states associated with those particular Dioceses. For us here in New York this day is a Holy Day of

Obligation. That means that as Catholics we must go to Mass this day unless we are sick or have other circumstances keeping us form going.

Elsewhere throughout the United States, this Solemnity is celebrated on Sunday May 12, 2024. What gives us an advantage here is that we can celebrate all the Sundays of the Easter Season including the 7<sup>th</sup> Sunday of Easter and cover the Scriptures associated with it. This I think gives us a fuller experience of the power of the Lord's resurrection in our lives.

Masses for the Holy Day of Obligation for the Ascension are as follows:

Wednesday May 8: 5:00pm, Thursday May 9: 6:45 am, 9:00am, 7:30pm.

#### What is Ascension?

The Ascension marks the completion of Jesus' historical ministry and the beginning of our own commission to proclaim the Gospel. We do not do this on our own authority. We undertake our mission "through the Holy Spirit" and manifest the Holy Spirit through our works of faith, prayer and charity. We must always remember that the mission is not our own but that of Christ's. Our continuing the mission to proclaim the Gospel (Ascension) is always in the light of the risen Christ (Easter) and empowered by the Spirit (Pentecost). Easter, Ascension, Pentecost known as the Paschal Mystery are all one mystery. We celebrate this at each Mass every Sunday and weekday.

We participate in Christ's ministry by proclaiming the Gospel from the time of His Ascension into Heaven where He remains at the Father's right hand until he comes again to judge the living and the dead. It is at this time that the period ordained by God for the Church's children to increase and multiply, comes to a completion. Christ will come back in the same body with which he Ascended as the Lord of Heaven and earth.

Even though Jesus is in Heaven, He has not left us. Our Redeemer's visible presence has passed into the sacraments. Our faith is now nobler and stronger because sight has been replaced by a doctrine whose authority is accepted by believing hearts and enlightened from on high.



In the Gospel of John Jesus tells us:

Very truly, I tell you, the one who believes in me will also do the works that I do and, in fact, will do greater works than these, because I am going to the Father. But the Advocate, the Holy Spirit, whom the Father will send in my name, will teach you everything, and remind you of all that I have said to you. And you will do greater works than me. (John 14:12) Why? Because He is no longer limited as He was as a human being while still being God on earth. Now, Jesus Christ is in all of us, the sacraments and the Church. Here is a

great reflection on what the Ascension now means for us today.

Christ has no body now on earth but yours;

No Hands but yours;

No feet but yours:

Yours are the eyes through which Christ's compassion looks out into the world;

Yours are the feet with which he is to go about doing good; Yours are the hands with which he is to bless now.

# Reflection for Next Sunday The Ascension of the Lord May 12, 2024

First Reading: Acts of the Apostles 1:1-11 Second Reading: Ephesians 1:17-23 or 4:1-13 Gospel Reading: Mark 16:15-20

Jesus is taken to heaven, and the disciples go forth to preach as Jesus commanded.

# **Family Connection**

It can be very important whom we sit next to. Any family that has tried to sit down to a family dinner or packed the car for a trip has heard children argue at least once about who should sit where. To sit next to someone, especially if that person is important, is to have a place of honor. Jesus has this place of honor seated at God's right hand, but there's more to this metaphor than where Jesus sits in relation to God. To be in the place of honor is also to be in a place of power. Knowing people in powerful places can be helpful. Our children remind us of this each time we are called upon to referee a conflict. Jesus, honored at God's right hand, is a powerful ally for us.

As you gather as a family, recall a time when there was a discussion, or perhaps even an argument, about where people were going to sit. Talk about why it might be important to a person to sit in a particular place. Observe that in today's Gospel we will learn about Jesus' place in heaven. Read together today's Gospel, Mark 16:15-20. Talk about what we might learn about the relationship between God and Jesus from today's Gospel and what we learn about Jesus' relationship to us. Observe that one of the things we learn is that Jesus continues to help us from this place of honor in heaven. Pray together the Apostles' Creed.



# THURSDAY MAY 9TH

#### ADORATION - NOON to Benediction at 4:45 PM

REFLECTIONS: THE ASCENSION OF OUR LORD

LET US ALWAYS REMEMBER: JESUS GAVE INSTRUCTIONS, AND THEN JESUS TOOK HIS PLACE.

With joy then and fresh resolves for the future, let us reflect briefly on the great mystery of today's liturgy. In the Scripture readings the whole significance of Christ's Ascension is summarized for us. The richness of this mystery is spelled out in two statements: Jesus gave instructions, and then Jesus took his place.

In the providence of God – in the eternal design of the Father – the hour had come for Christ to go away. He would leave his Apostles behind, with his Mother Mary, but only after he had given them his instructions. The Apostles now had a mission to perform according to the instructions that Jesus left, and these instructions were in turn the faithful expression of the Father's will.

The instructions indicated, above all, that the Apostles were to wait for the Holy Spirit, who was the gift of the Father. From the beginning, it had to be crystal-clear that the source of the Apostles' strength is the Holy Spirit. It is the Holy Spirit who guides the Church in the way of truth; the Gospel is to spread through the power of God, and not by means of human wisdom or strength.

The Apostles, moreover, were instructed to teach – to proclaim the Good News to the whole world. And they were to baptize in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. Like Jesus, they were to speak explicitly about the Kingdom of God and about salvation. The Apostles were to give witness to Christ to the ends of the earth. The early Church clearly understood these instructions and the missionary era began. And everybody knew that this missionary era could never end until the same Jesus, who went up to heaven, would come back again.

The words of Jesus became a treasure for the Church to guard and to proclaim, to meditate on and to thrive. And at the same time, the Holy Spirit implanted in the Church an apostolic charism, in order to keep this revelation intact. Through his words Jesus was to live on in his Church: I am with you always. And so the whole ecclesial community became conscious of the need for fidelity to the instructions of Jesus, to the deposit of faith. This solicitude was to pass from generation to generation – down to our own day. And it was because of this principle that I spoke recently to your own Rectors, stating that the first priority for seminaries today is the teaching of God's word in all its purity and integrity, with all its exigencies and in all its power. The word of God – and the word of God alone – is the basis for all ministry, for all pastoral activity, for all priestly action. The power of God's word constituted the dynamic basis of the Second Vatican Council, and John XXIII pointed out clearly on the day it opened: 'The greatest concern of the Ecumenical Council is this: that the sacred deposit of Christian doctrine should be more effectively quarded and taught'. And if the seminarians of this generation are to be adequately prepared to take on the heritage and challenge of this Council they must be trained above all in God's word: in 'the sacred deposit of Christian doctrine' Yes, dear sons, our greatest challenge is to be faithful to the instructions of the Lord Jesus.

And the second reflection on the meaning of the Ascension is found in this phrase: Jesus took his place. After having undergone the humiliation of his passion and death, Jesus took his place at the right-hand of God; he took his place with his eternal Father. But he also entered heaven as our Head. Whereupon, in the expression of Leo the Great, the glory of the Head became the hope of the body. For all eternity Christ takes is place as the firstborn among many brethren: our nature is with God in Christ. And as man, the Lord Jesus lives for ever to intercede for us with Father. At the same time, from his throne of glory, Jesus sends out to the whole Church a message of hope and a call to holiness.

Because of Christ's merits, because of his intercession with the Father, we are able to attain justice and holiness of life, in him. The Church may indeed experience difficulties, the Gospel may suffer setbacks, but because Jesus is at the right-hand of the Father the Church will never know defeat. Christ's victory is ours. The power of the glorified Christ, the beloved Son of the eternal Father, is superabundant, to sustain each of us and all of us in the fidelity of our dedication to God's Kingdom and in the generosity of our celibacy. The efficacy of Christ's Ascension touches all us in the concrete reality of our daily lives. Because of this mystery it is the vocation of the whole Church to wait in joyful hope for the coming of our Saviour, Jesus Christ. HOMILY OF JOHN PAUL II 24 May 1979







# Focus on Religious Freedom

"Parents should teach children to avoid the compromising and degrading influences which threaten human societies." - Catechism of the Catholic Church (CCC) 2224

Sexual orientation and gender ideology have been added to the traditional definition of sex as male and female for the purposes of Title IX of the 1972 Federal Education Amendments. Title IX gave women equal opportunities to men in sports, scholarships, and programs in schools by preventing discrimination in activities and programs which receive federal funding.

The administration's changes to Title IX, as of Aug.1, 2024, will conflict with the religious beliefs of millions of Americans whose faiths teach that God created two sexes, male and female. Teachers and students whose religious beliefs in this regard differ from this newly mandated definition will be at risk of discipline, termination and religious discrimination if they continue to live and exercise their faith as set forth in the 1st Amendment

The new rule equates self-chosen gender identity with Godgiven biological sex and says that a person's self-chosen gender identity cannot prevent their participation in <a href="mailto:any">any</a> education program or activity. Attorneys studying the redefinitions foresee that the rule will not allow separate bathrooms, locker rooms, and housing for biological males and females and that women's sports will be endangered. The rule will give legal support to those state and local governments that are already making policy and forcing adherence to these cultural influences.

Following the same ideology, New York state will vote this Nov.5 on a state Constitutional amendment to expand the equal protection clause of the New York state constitution. That clause currently protects from discrimination by race, color, creed or religion. Proposed changes would add protected categories of age, gender identity, gender expression, reproductive healthcare and autonomy.

The federal Title IX redefinitions and proposed New York state's constitutional amendment are seen by many as cultural bombs... imposing an ideology that denies millions of Americans important and basic religious beliefs as well as their right to live their faith and educate their children in their faith.

As summarized by an attorney familiar with these issues, "These redefinitions at the federal and state levels are the same in their intent. However, because one is a federal law and the other a state constitutional amendment, they can be weaponized in different ways by different government entities and private citizens, with different penalties and civil damages that can be levied in different regulatory and judicial forums. So, they open a multi-front war. That dangerous fact should not be underestimated."






